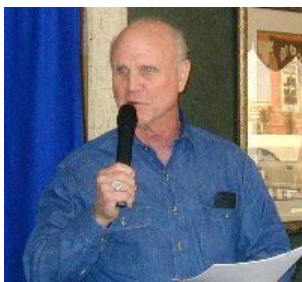

On **February 17, 2010**, 54 members and guests attended the business luncheon meeting at the America Buffet. In part they came to hear our speaker, Steve Thomas, who works with AARP services, Tax-Aide.




Ralph Garcia introduced our February speaker, **Steve Thomas**, the Local Coordinator for five Fort Bend County libraries for AARP's Tax-Aide Program. The Tax-Aide Program is the nation's largest free, volunteer-run tax assistance and preparation service available to taxpayers with low- and moderate-income, with special attention to those age 60 and older. The service is staffed by dedicated volunteers such as Steve and our own Ralph Garcia.

Steve was born in Houston. He worked for Arthur Andersen & Co. and then for BFI for 24 years. Steve has been involved with AARP Tax-Aide 10 years or so. Doing taxes for him came naturally since he once did them professionally. He feels that doing taxes for people who come to Tax-Aide for help is much more rewarding than when he did it for a living. Steve went over a

long list of changes to the IRS Tax Laws that potentially could affect our members with their upcoming 2009 Tax Returns. He answered questions from the audience and encouraged us to take advantage of the free service available at Public Libraries in the area. Free, year-round assistance Tax-Aide offers via the Web allows taxpayers to pose questions to online volunteers 24 hours a day, seven days a week, from the comfort of home. 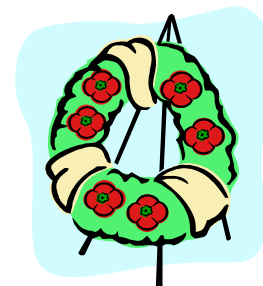

BINGO RULES

White Elephant Bingo

1. All games for the Pot Luck Bingo will be for Regular Bingo.

You can win by completing a line of consecutive numbers either Horizontal, Vertical, Diagonally or Four Corners. The middle number where the middle and the diagonal lines intersect is a FREE number

2. Bingo for White Elephant Gifts will be played until all the gifts are won. Everyone should be able to win at least one gift.
3. In order to speed things up, once declared a winner, please go to the closest end of the table where the gifts are located and you will be given one of the White Elephant Prizes members or guest brought in. We will work from the end to the middle of the table until all the gifts are given away. The caller will continue to call numbers until all the gifts are given away for that game.

Do not clear your card until you have won or all the prizes for that game have been won!
Once a person wins he no longer can play until a new game is started!

Special Bingo

Cards must be purchased and marked to be able to play!

1. **Special Bingo** will be played according to available time and until all gifts are won. If enough time is available we will play for one gift per game. With the exception of the last game, all games will be for Regular Bingo. (As in 1. of Pot Luck Bingo)

The last game for the \$50 certificate will require that all the numbers on the card be covered.

2. **If time becomes a factor**, we can designate more than one prize per game with the exception of the last game which will be a cover all game for a \$50 gift Certificate.
3. **Tie Breaker:**
 - A. Ties will be broken by rolling dice. The highest roller wins the prize or the first choice of multiple prizes.
 - B. If the tie is for more than two prizes the player/s that tied will roll for the next choices until the designated prizes are won.
 - C. If after the ties have been broken, designated prizes still remain for that game the Caller will continue to call bingo until all the prizes are won for that game.
4. **The last game for the \$50 prize will require that the player cover all the numbers on the card according to the numbers called.**

Do not clear your card until the winners have been verified !!
